



At Circle Urban Ministries, our mission goes beyond providing essential services—Circle is a key driver of economic stability and growth in the Austin community. Through education, healthcare, housing, spiritual care and food security, our campus houses more than \$50 million in annual resources and serves as a hub of opportunity, ensuring that thousands of individuals each year have access to the resources they need to thrive.

A recent study conducted by the University of Chicago and the American Medical
Association has revealed the true economic impact of the Circle campus. The data confirms that for every dollar invested in Circle Urban Ministries, there is a social return on investment (SROI) of \$8.60. This means that the work happening on our campus does not just address immediate needs—it creates lasting financial and social benefits for families, businesses, and future generations. 



Kehrein Center for the Arts

The Kehrein Center for the Arts (KCA) is a 900-seat performing arts venue dedicated to cultural restoration and community engagement in Austin. **Completed in 2019, this \$5 million investment** stands as one of the largest artscentered revitalization project in the community since the 1968 riots. Named after Circle's founder, Glen Kehrein, the KCA provides a state-of-the-art space for performances, civic discussions, and arts education, with a special focus on uplifting artists and storytellers.

Looking Ahead: Building Stability for the Future



Every decade, Circle Urban Ministries takes on a major systemic challenge in the Austin community, ensuring long-term transformation and impact. In 2021, we launched a bold initiative focused on housing security, recognizing that stable, affordable housing is essential for community resilience. Today, we are actively renovating a 10-unit building to provide more housing options for families in need, while also building a brand-new home from the ground up—Project 843—designed to create pathways to homeownership and generational wealth. As we move forward, Circle remains committed to addressing systemic barriers, strengthening families, and building a future where every resident has the opportunity to thrive.



Project 130

Project 130 is a 10-unit ADA-compliant housing development designed to provide safe, stable, and accessible housing for families in the Austin community. With framing complete and HVAC installation nearing completion, this renovation is well underway, bringing us closer to addressing the critical need for families in transition.

Project 843

Project 843 is a ground-up home construction designed to empower families with the opportunity for homeownership in the Austin community. This initiative is part of Circle Urban Ministries' commitment to breaking systemic barriers and fostering generational wealth through stable housing.
