About Circle

Circle Urban Ministries is a Community Development non-profit organization working toward the day people in underserved communities have a safe and healthy place to live, learn and play. Circle Urban Ministries provides a 360-degree approach to community development. Circle Urban Ministries...

1. identifies deteriorating / underutilized community assets;
2. partners with organizations to rehabilitate identified community asset(s);
3. generates consistent revenue by renting the rehabilitated asset to community partner agencies who provide a needed community service;
4. and reinvests the revenue into community programming (i.e. afterschool programming for youth and teens, food pantry and crisis intervention).

Circle's Community Impact 2019-2020

According to census data, the Austin community is home to 97,600 residence. Circle Urban Ministries' campus serves more than 9,600 individuals a year (nearly 10% of all Austin residence). Circle's goal is to serve 15% of Austin's residence by 2022.
